

Veterans' Rest Stop is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation established for the purpose of assisting veterans of the US Armed Forces who are in need of counseling and mentoring due to facing issues such as addictions, under-employment, medical issues, homelessness, domestic relations issues, personal issues and the like. Jack secured funding for VRS development (\$240,000.)

Current instructor at New England Disabled Sports based at Loon Mountain and Bretton Woods.

Has been a volunteer for 29 years at New England Disabled Sports, working with Veterans and individuals with various disabilities.

Partnered with New Hampshire Scots Association to have the International Board of Highland Games establish the first recognized Adaptive Highland Games competition for individuals with disabilities as an annual competition within the New Hampshire Highland Games.

Current Vice-President of Loon Mountain Area Community Fund which provides financial assistance to Veterans and other community members who have fallen on hard times.
